Morning Drop Off:

- Camp hours are from 8:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.
- All parents must use the front entrance closest to the family center (cafeteria). Please do not block the driveways.

Afternoon Pick Up:

- Pick up will be in the same area as drop off. (Family Center)
- Campers are expected to be picked up no later than 2:00 p.m. Aftercare will not be offered after 2:00 p.m.
- Parents must sign campers out at all times.

Field Trips:

- Every week there are different field trips scheduled. Please see the field trip calendar.
- A camp director and assistant director will always accompany the groups on field trips.
- There are certain days where lunch is provided. Please see field trip schedule for details.
- Parents may accompany the group field trips. Adults accompanying campers on field trips must cover the cost of their entrance fee.

Dress Code:

- Each camper will receive two Camp STA shirts. Camp STA campers must wear Camp STA shirts on all field trips.
- Socks and sneakers are required.
- Sandals are allowed on water days only.
- A change of clothes and a towel are required for water days as well.
- Tank tops are not allowed.
